Khan Abdul Wali Khan (Pashto: آبدول والي خان, Urdu: آبدول والي خان, born: 11 January 1917 – 26 January 2006) was a British Indian and later Pakistani secular democratic socialist and Pashtun leader, and served as president of National Awami Party. Khudai Khidmatgar (Pashto: خدايي خدمتگار; literally "servants of God") was a Pashtun non-violent movement against the British Empire by the Pashtun people of the North-West Frontier Province (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa) of British India (now in Pakistan). The Babra massacre of the Khyber Pakhtunwa region is an incident which happened 71 years ago on this day and is rarely mentioned in the history books of either Pakistan or India. Under the leadership of Gandhiji, the Civil Disobedience Movement was launched in AD 1930. It began with the Dandi March. On 12 March 1930, Gandhiji with some of his followers left the Sabarmati Ashram at Ahmedabad and made their way towards Dandi, a village on the west coast of India.
