Sonority is a nonbinary phonological feature categorizing sounds into a relative scale. Many versions of the sonority hierarchy exist; a common one is vowels > glides > liquids > nasals > obstruents. A rhyme is a repetition of similar sounds (usually, the exact same sound) in the final stressed syllables (and any following syllables) of two or more words. Portuguese and Spanish, although closely related sister languages, differ in many details of their phonology, grammar, and lexicon. Both are part of a broader group known as West Iberian Romance, which also includes several other languages or dialects with fewer speakers, all of which are mutually intelligible to some degree.
