I have found it helpful to envision the RTI framework as a three-legged stool. The three legs are (1) an assessment process, (2) a tiered intervention menu, and (3) a problem-solving process. Schools are always trying to come up with different strategies to close the achievement gap and enhance student growth. While many strategies show temporary successes, often they are not sustained because they fail to be established campuswide or practiced with fidelity. Although Congress can share the blame for creating the education system we now see in almost every U.S. school, we should also recognize that in 2004, Congress provided educators with an option that just might help us undo some of the mistakes of the past and close the current reading achievement gap: the Response to Intervention (RTI) initiative.
