His novel *Émile* was the most significant book on education after Plato's *Republic*, and his other work had a profound impact on political theory and practice, romanticism and the development of the novel. Simón Bolívar penned two political treatises—the *Manifiesto de Cartagena* (“Cartagena Manifesto”) and the *Carta de Jamaica* (“Letter from Jamaica”)—encouraging the people of South America to rebel against Spanish colonial rule.
