The anonymous 'Perlesvaus' (entitled 'The High History of the Holy Grail' by Sebastian Evans in his translation) is believed to have been composed on the continent of Europe, circa 1220-1230, as a continuation of Chretien DeTroyes' unfinished work "Perceval, or the Knight of the Grail". Perlesvaus, also called Li Hauz Livres du Graal (The High History of the Holy Grail), is an Old French Arthurian romance dating to the first decade of the 13th century. It purports to be a continuation of Chrétien de Troyes unfinished Perceval, the Story of the Grail, but it has been called the least canonical Arthurian tale because of its striking differences from other versions. In The High History of the Grail, Perceval (Perlesvaus), then Gawain, then Lancelot fails to recover the Grail. The king dies before Perceval can have another attempt.
