A cowboy is an animal herder who tends cattle on ranches in North America, traditionally on horseback, and often performs a multitude of other ranch-related tasks. For western riding and showing, western riders wear cowboy boots, with either the high "cowboy" or "riding" heel; the intermediate, somewhat lower "walking" heel; or the low, "roper" style heel that is similar to that of English boots. "Open Range" inspired the popular song written in the 1930s, "Don't Fence Me In." Composer Cole Porter created that song with Montana engineer, writer and poet, Robert "Bob" Fletcher (1885-1972).
