The Divine Comedy (Italian: *Divina Commedia* [diˈviːna komˈmɛːdja]) is an Italian long narrative poem by Dante Alighieri, begun c. 1308 and completed in 1320, a year before his death in 1321. The Divine Comedy by Dante Alighieri is a long allegorical poem in three parts (or canticas): the Inferno , Purgatorio , and Paradiso , and 100 cantos, with the Inferno having 34, Purgatorio having 33, and Paradiso having 33 cantos. La Comedìa, o Commedia, conosciuta soprattutto come Divina Commedia, è un poema allegorico-didascalico di Dante Alighieri, scritto in terzine incatenate di endecasillabi (poi chiamate per antonomasia terzine dantesche) in lingua volgare fiorentina.
