Charlemagne (/ ʃ ɑːr l ɛ m ɛ n /) or Charles the Great (German: Karl der Große, Italian: Carlo Magno/Carlomagno; 2 April 742 – 28 January 814), numbered Charles I, was King of the Franks from 768, King of the Lombards from 774, and Holy Roman Emperor from 800. An emperor (through Old French empereor from Latin imperator) is a monarch, and usually the sovereign ruler of an empire or another type of imperial realm.
