Relatively to the other works of Dickens Oliver Twist is not of great value, but it is of great importance. Some parts of it are so crude and of so clumsy a melodrama, that one is almost tempted to say that Dickens would have been greater without it. Oliver Twist is a 1997 American made-for-television film based on Charles Dickens's 1839 novel of the same title. The film was directed by Tony Bill, written by Monte Merrick and Stephen Sommers, and produced by Walt Disney Television. Oliver Twist is a 1933 American pre-Code film directed by William J. Cowen. It is the earliest sound version of Charles Dickens's novel of the same name. Oliver Twist was first published in 1837 in serial format, in Bentley's Miscellany, which Dickens was editing at the time. Oliver Twist was Dickens's second novel and his first real social novel, critiquing the harm public institutions inflicted on the poor.
